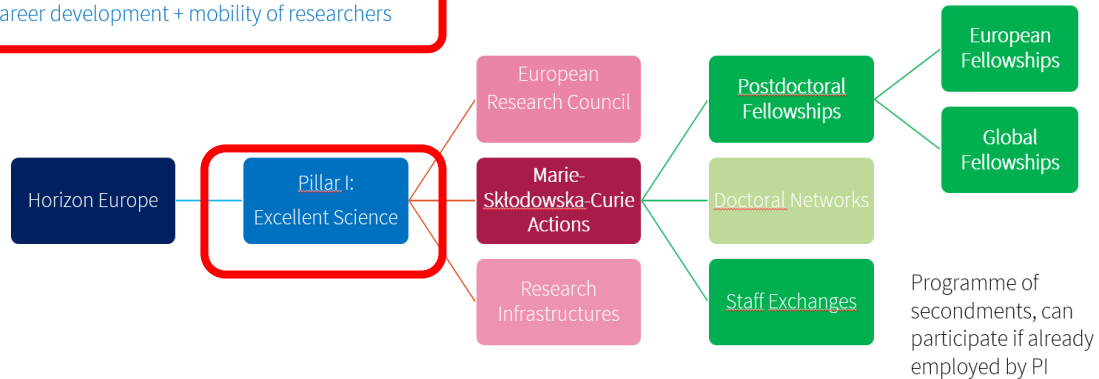

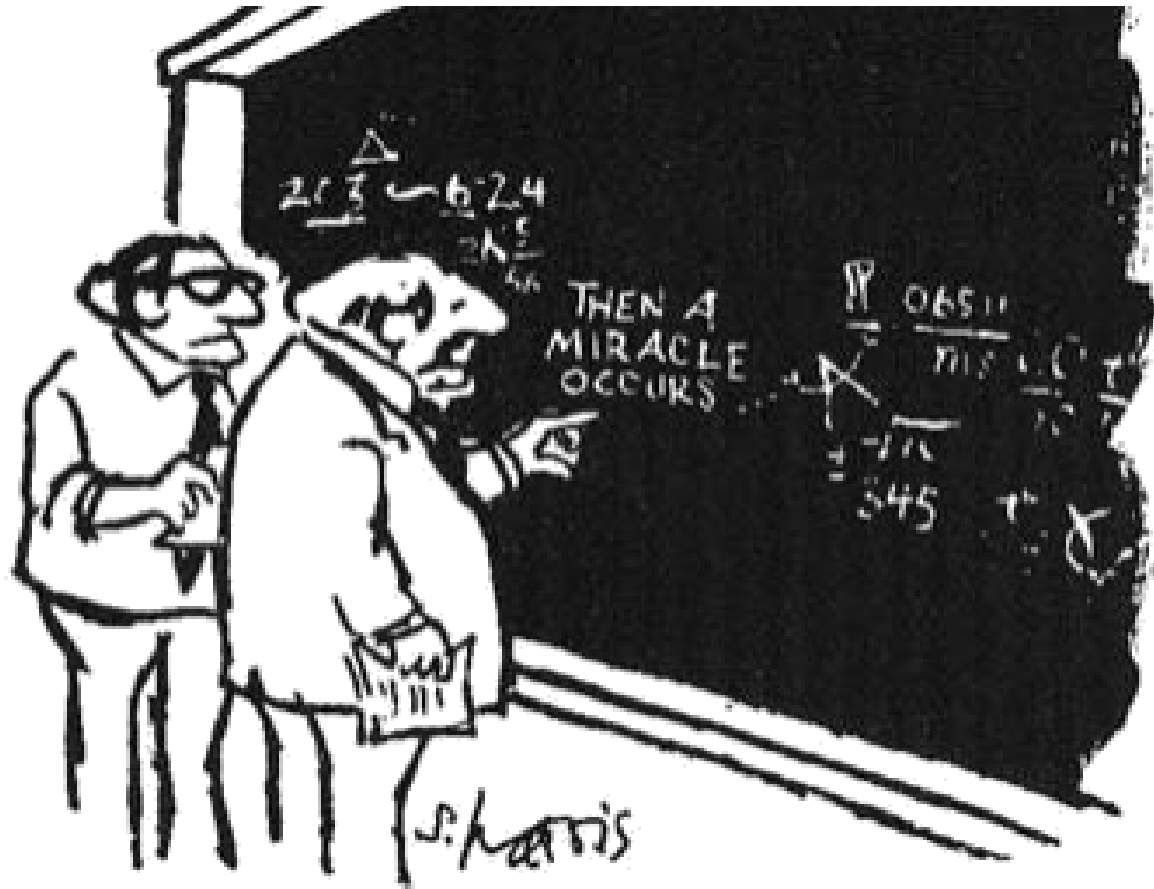

Evaluation 1. Current State of Research

R1: As for transnational intellectual and university history she surely has. As for migration history, there are some deficiencies [...]. Especially the theoretical and typological work by [...] (... , 2013), [...] (... , 2009 and 2011). As does [...] et al. 2011.

Given the central questions and research design she will have little trouble hooking up with these new approaches.

R2: ...clearly has a tremendously strong understanding of the relevant histories along with a real sense of the contribution she will make to it. I am very impressed with her control of the materials.

Evaluation 2. Research Questions

R2: ...absolutely clear. Even more importantly, there is a genuine gap which will be filled by Ms. XYZ's research

R1: In general, yes. But [...] she could profit very much by using new approaches and typologies...

R3: Yes, these are all quite clear and valid.

Evaluation 3. Originality & Relevance (1)

R1: ...highly original research project and fits very well in the new directions in migration history...

R1: ...possibility to link up with recent work on cultural industries [...]. When embedded in these new directions it has the potential to become really cutting edge.

R2: ...truly exciting research project, bringing together the history of anthropology, the history of migration,
...

R2: ...will greatly contribute to our understanding of the history of the behavioral sciences in general, and its transnational aspects in particular...

Evaluation 3. Originality & Relevance (2)

R2: Having myself worked on the transnational aspects in the history of German anthropology [...], I am truly excited about this innovative proposition.

R3: ...fits into current trends in both the history of science as well as history more generally,

R3: My only advice [...] would be not to limit the study to a East-West exchange but to be aware of the broader circulation [...]

Evaluation 4. Work Plan

R1: No problems here, as far as I can judge.

R2: ...project is clearly articulated, especially in regard to the various archival collections that need to be consulted [...] fact that some of those are not even open to the general scholarly public is particularly exciting.

R3: Yes, I see no problems with the time line or the proposed methods.

Evaluation 5. Applicant

R2: ...brings a strong set of experiences and expertise to her research...

R2 ...excellent training in [...], which is essential to her success...

R2: What shows [her] readiness most clearly, however, is her **research proposal**, which [...] shows tremendous understanding of the stakes of her project.

R3: Judging from the **quality of the proposal** she also has the ability to write up a high quality paper as well.

Evaluation 6. Scientific Environment

R1: Excellent [...], she could easily turn to the group [...] at Vienna University, who have an excellent track record...

R2: I cannot think of a better constellation of scholars and institutional resources for this project.

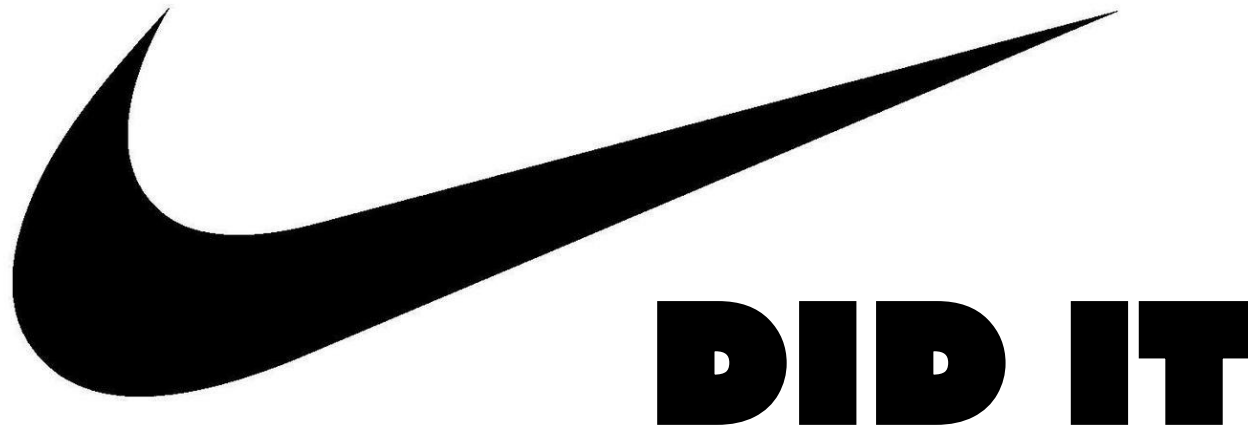
R3: These are good choices. Adding to them would not necessarily enhance the project.

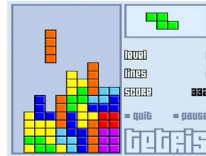

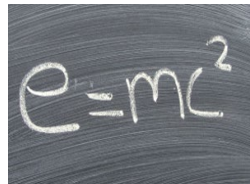
